Career Awareness for Schoolchildren Ages 9-12

This program has been developed by Kappa Omicron Nu to give college students and professionals the resources necessary to share hands-on Human Sciences (HS) experiences with schoolchildren ages 9-12. This program intends to make a contribution to understanding of human sciences careers by showing children that:

- HS makes important contributions to everyday life.
- Children can use HS knowledge to improve their lives.
- Careers in HS can be fun and satisfying.

How does the program work? The **Kids & Careers** program provides college students and professionals with kits of a wide variety of hands-on HS activities and demonstrations that are safe and age-appropriate. Existing activities will be collected in a central resource. Each activity will conclude with a short description of the applicable career, including how specialized knowledge is used in professional practice.

The Kappa Omicron Nu Board of Directors launched the program with chapters at Conclave 2003. Other high school and college student groups are encouraged to participate.

Global Summit on Social Responsibility

Kappa Omicron Nu and the Association of College Honor Societies were represented by Dorothy Mitstifer at the SR Summit sponsored by the American Society of Association Executives. The Summit held April 30-May 2, 2008 at the new Gaylord National Resort & Conference Center near Washington, DC, captured both a live and virtual flood of enthusiasm and ideas for how associations can help solve some of the world's biggest problems. The Global Summit was designed to accomplish five goals: share strengths and celebrate successes, further the business case for social responsibility, identify the unique competencies and capacities that associations bring to social responsibility, generate guiding social responsibility principles for associations, and take action. The "appreciative inquiry" planning process was used as a strength-based approach to change. Alignment of strengths makes weaknesses irrelevant.

Mitstifer is a member of a task group that is working on branding the SR initiative with **Seven Wonders of the Socially Responsible World**—peace/security, education, environment, health, social justice, prosperity, and innovation/technology—see Sachs, J.
